From the Pastor's Desk

Psalm 23:2-3 state, "He maketh me to lie down in green pastures: he leadeth me beside the still waters. He restoreth my soul: he leadeth me in the paths of righteousness for his name's sake."

This portion of the 23rd Psalm is all about how the Shepherd sustains and

preserves His flock. The LORD, as our Shepherd, knows His flock best. Therefore, there will be times when the Shepherd will make His sheep lie down in a place of rest. This place of rest is not just a physical place but also a spiritual refuge. God knows exactly what we need and when we need it.

This scripture also helps us to understand the incredible loving nature of The Great Shepherd. The image of green pastures is rich and beautiful. But, it also represents a special place of



comfort and safety where the Shepherd leads His flock for restoration and refreshment.

Philip Keller writes that sheep do not lie down easily, and will not unless certain conditions are met. Because they are apprehensive, they will not lie down if they are afraid. Because they are social animals they will not lie down if there is conflict among the sheep. Finally, if sheep are in need of food or hungry, they will not lie down either. True rest only comes when the shepherd has met all their

needs. Church family, we serve a loving and caring God that meets our every need and leads us beside the still waters of life to comfort our souls. Rest in Him.

The image of green pastures and still waters was a figurative place of restoration for David's soul. David was not perfect by any stretch of the imagination and he knew it. Therefore, he was totally dependent upon The Great Shepherd to restore him. Isaiah 53:6a states, "We all, like sheep, have gone astray, each of us has turned to our own way." In short, we all need to be restored by The Great Shepherd. "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (Romans 3:23).

In Hebrew, the words "restores my soul" means brings me to repentance. Simply put, the pathway to restoration is repentance. And, The Great Shepherd is willing and able to restore as long as we repent of our sins (Acts 3:19). The Great Shepherd is our guide to the green pastures and still waters of righteousness.



God's guidance for our soul is like a moral compass. God will show us the way and remove all obstructions for His name's sake. The Great Shepherd is passionately committed to our wellbeing; not because we've been so good or that we deserve it. But, because He finds great value in each of us and wants

us to be all that we can be.

Let us pray: Lord, renew our heart and restore our soul for Your name's sake in Jesus' name we pray. Amen.

When her arthritis got so bad in her knees that she spent most of her day in the wheelchair, she had to decline doing things that, at any other time, she would have been right in the midst of. She loved watching the children



at church. She'd come to watch the VBS activities and was always willing

and ready to listen to the kids if they wanted to show her something or tell



her something. And babies! She loved holding the babies! And she's been around so long that she's held two generations! And as we all celebrated in 2021, mom was dedicated to playing the organ for the church. For 50 years! Her favorite part of that day was the plaque that was put on the organ with her name on it. She LOVED that. And I am so glad we were able to celebrate her on that day. Thank you to everyone who helped us honor her. I loved that so many people at church just kind of lit






Think Spring!
